ICC Launches Green Construction Code. The ICC launched its International Green Construction Code (IGCC) initiative on June 29th, which will reduce energy usage and the carbon footprint of commercial buildings. Entitled "IGCC: Safe and Sustainable by the Book," the initiative is committed to develop a model code focused on new and existing commercial buildings. This action is designed to provide a coordinated code with other International Codes that will meet the requirements of the Virginia Graeme Baker Act and upgrade pool safety. "The Board's unanimous action in voting to move this forward demonstrates an understanding of the immediate need in our jurisdictions for this type of a code," said Board President Adolf Zubia.
